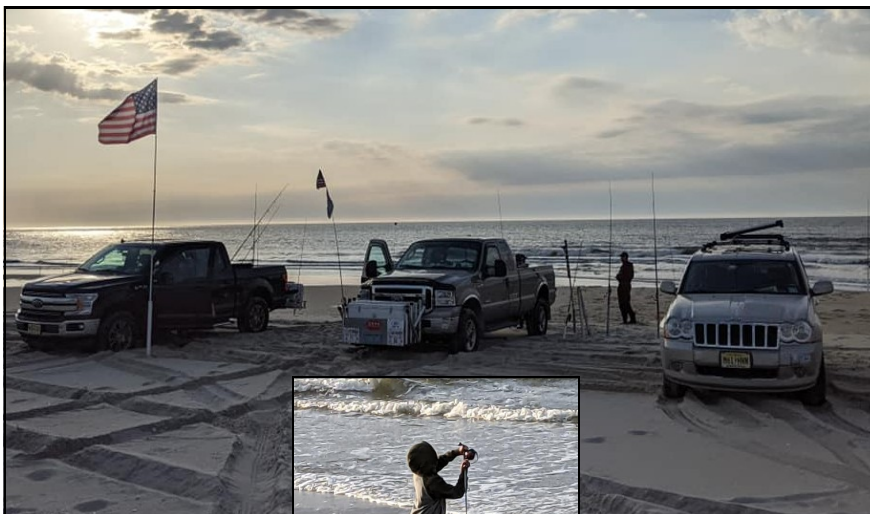


FISHING INDIANS

MY TREASURERED 64 YEAR FRIENDSHIP

Many years ago there was a little hunting and fishing shop in Mount Ephraim (Camden County) where I hung a bit. It was here, about 1957, my friendship with Jim Gilkey began and grew over all these years. I knew there was “chemistry” early on.

Graveling Point and Island Beach were our early go-to fishing spots. At Island Beach I had my Ford Model A beach buggy “Sand Hopper.” Jim would often join me. At about the same time we then both purchased Jeep Utility Wagons. Several years later we both had self-contained rigs. At Island Beach or Montauk Point our buggies often looked like bookends on the beach.

Jim retired from his extermination business and became a fixture at Island Beach, affectionately known to many as “Bugman” for obvious reasons.

During our lengthy friendship we shed some tears of sadness, but for the most part there were tears from laughter. We would discuss everything and anything over coffee, a camper dinner or an Old No. 7. Regarding dinners... Jim would eat anything! When a plate full of whatever was placed in front of him, he would curl his nose and exclaim in a whiney voice, “I don’t like that”, and then proceed to ravenously devour it. One of our memorable dining experiences we often fondly recalled was after a fishing session the two of us shared a pound of spaghetti w/meatballs, a large salad and several ears of Jersey corn. All washed down with a couple of beers of course. It was a lot of food!

It was these in-between fishing moments over the years that I really got to know and admire Jim. Being born in 1924 meant he grew up during the Depression and was of age to serve in World War II. His military service was of great pride to him. He went in the Army early in the war and first served in the North Africa campaign in artillery and then onto Sicily and the invasion of Italy. It was in Italy where he transferred to become a tank driver serving in northern Italy in the Apennines and Monte Cassino battles.

Like most combat veterans Jim was very reluctant to talk about his combat experiences. I learned early on to avoid this subject. He would discuss some of his noncombat experiences. It was obvious he was very proud to have been a tanker. He spoke of life as a tanker and his crew members fondly.

At the end of the war Jim married Lucille. They were together until his death. That’s 75 years folks! They had three children, but sadly two passed away in their adult years.



Jim supported me greatly during my years as NJBBA President. He served as a Director and Editor of our newspaper, and did an outstanding job.

Sadness for Jim and Lucille struck again when hurricane Sandy ripped along the coast. They basically lost everything. Fortunately Jim's military awards and memorabilia were displayed on the wall and were rescued. Imagine having to start all over while in your late eighties.

Old Father Time caught up to Jim and he sold his buggy and for the most part stopped surf fishing. For a number of years when I returned to Island Beach for the fall run he would join me for a week or so, adding to our memories.

Then there was the occasion of his visit to my home in Wyoming. We spent a week traveling around beautiful Wyoming in my RV. I know he enjoyed this trip as much as I. More memories added.

I'm aware end of life timing is really not predictable in most cases, but Jim's was terrible due to damn COVID-19. Jim was in various hospital, rehab and nursery home facilities where he was unable to have Lucille, his daughter Diane or friends visit. Tears flow when I think of how my dear friend of 64 years had to depart this earth.

As I was gathering thoughts for this remembrance Tom Brokaw came to mind. I think Jim and Lucille Gilkey could have been on the cover of his book, "The Greatest Generation." I admire them for their ability to overcome their life's travails while maintaining their humor and love of life.

I know when I meet Jim again he will immediately tell me if they're hitting hard plastic, soft plastic, wood, metal or bait.

**Rest in Peace Jim.
God Bless Lucille.
I love them both.**

New Jersey Beach Buggy Association Code of Ethics

- To enter and leave beaches in prescribed ways.
- To eliminate speeding and reckless driving.
- To respect local ordinances and the rights of property owners.
- To offer aid to any fisherman or buggy owner in trouble on the beach.
- To respect picnicking and bathing groups by: (a) avoiding them whenever possible; (b) by slowing to minimum speed when passing picnicking or bathing groups.
- To avoid littering the beach with trash, cans, etc.. by using trash barrels when available, or by taking it with you when leaving the area.
- To avoid over-crowding any one area and elbowing other anglers out of their chosen spots. This is particularly important where surf men without buggies are concentrated.
- To leave the track when a halt is made, so that other buggies will not be forced to detour.
- To fill in holes after getting stuck, and to avoid indiscriminately crisscrossing tracks.
- To observe the rules of common courtesy on the beach.
- Simplify passing of vehicles meeting head-on in a single track: The driver who has the dunes on his right will be required to turn out of the track to the right. This rule to be tempered with common sense in difficult circumstances.
- To ask those who park their gear in the middle of the track if they will move it and explain in a courteous manner why.
- Do not drive at night without lights, but when approaching fishermen, drive behind them and avoid shining lights on fishermen and water.
- To realize that fishing is a God-given sport and to keep it on a high plane so that others may enjoy it as well

Only NJ Saltwater Fishing size limits will qualify. **NO** undersize Fluke from IBSP or Delaware Bay or **Striped Bass Bonus** tagged fish will qualify.
All fish must be caught by hook and line/rod and reel between March 1 and December 31 from the surf, bay shore, pier or jetties in New Jersey waters (no boats).
Species included are Northern Kingfish, Bluefish, Striped Bass, Weak Fish and Fluke.
There will be a 1st, 2nd and 3rd prize in each category, with \$50 for 1st, \$30 for 2nd and \$15 for 3rd. No participant may win more than one prize for each category.
Prizes will be awarded at the Annual Banquet.
