PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Courtesy Patrol (CP) members are generally the most active of our membership and may go on to become officers or directors of the association. All of your NJBBA presidents have served or are serving as members of CP. Our efforts, as CP people, have shown a marked improvement in service to both our members and the non-fishing public. Yet one would be surprised as to how many individuals and groups have never heard of NJBBA and our efforts in protecting the beach resource and users.

A member of the CP has certain responsibilities not only to NJBBA members, but also for the general welfare of everything that happens on your beach. As a matter of fact, less time will be spent helping out NJBBGA members than non-members, since our membership is already informed on beach ethics and behavior. However, this is not to say that NJBBA members never get into trouble.

At renewal time or on a new membership application there is a check of if anyone is interested in joining a CP Applicant may also tell an officer, director, or CP coordinator of the interest. These names are put into a waiting list that is kept by the coordinators for them to reference when an opening occurs. When applying for the patrol, be sure to indicate which beach you prefer. Putting down several beaches only tends to confuse the issue and may cause confusion.

Each patrol has a set number of members based on the size of the beach and whether it is a year round beach as opposed to ones that are closed in the summer. Each patrol is balanced so that the proper amount of coverage is given to its particular area. An equal amount of locals and those that live away is the ideal situation so that the coverage will protect the resource both in season and out, weekends, weekdays, and evenings. Today's patrols have become dispensers of information, supplies, and membership kits. The politics of our hobby seems much more in the forefront. With added fishing pressure expect more questions on the how and where of serf fishing itself.

NJBBA is a partnership of many smaller local groups that work together for the purpose of keeping everyone's beach open. To expect complete support from other areas means support for each other in all of our endeavors. The association recommends CP members attend not only the conservation projects in your area, but to visit at least one other beach for an activity annually.

The coordinators have all the same concerns and responsibilities as a regular CP member plus they must make sure that the other patrol members are doing their job and that any pertinent information concerning beach access and preservation is properly passed along to a NJBBA officer. The coordinator must decide who is and is not performing, who is not showing up for projects and activities. NJBBA EXPECTS CP MEMBERS TO COOPERATE WITH THE COORDINATOR ON THIS. That information is weighed as to how the individual does at representing the patrol at meetings, activities and projects. The coordinator must make sure that the assistant coordinator is kept abreast of everything so that the link to report abuses is not interrupted.

Some beach authorities have rules which, by our experience, seem to be out of order with what we know better elsewhere. Until we can get those rules changed, we must set an example and not break them. When CP's are seen breaking the law, it reflects on the association as a whole. The CP is on the beach to patrol and safeguard our membership and the resource. The CP flag flown by patrol members is very effective in order to be seen, identified, and found when needed. Going about incognito leaves the rest of the patrol without support. When on the beach, CP members must agree to be visible.

NJBBA would like to know as much as possible about your beach. Who is the authority? How does each authority spend the permit money? What individuals, homeowners, groups, or organizations are interested in seeing your beach closed to buggies? What environmental problems may cause you to lose access to part of your entire beach? What environmental programs or projects do you see that would be useful to us in stopping specific or general problems? What walk on problems do you see? Who are the locals that might be helpful if a problem arises?

The lifeblood of NJBBA is the membership and how we act on the beach. There seems to be plenty of mobile sport fishermen who join the association not understanding what we stand for and what we do. Courtesy Patrol members are an invaluable means to get this information out on the local level.

NEW AIR COMPRESSOR AT IBSP

The New Jersey Beach Buggy Association has purchased and donated a new air compressor for use by the recreational mobile sport fishing community at the air station in the office parking lot at IBSP. The new air compressor is a beefy unit. It has a two stage 5hp motor and puts out 16.5 cfm.

The NJBBA is also responsible for fixing the A7 air compressor 5 years ago when the electric motor failed. The NJBBA purchased a new electric motor in September of 2013 and installed it. The Berkeley Striper Club donated money for half the cost. Then Paul Harris had the idea to have the burned out motor rebuilt and it was taken to Lakewood Electric. The NJBBA picked up the tab and the rebuilt electric motor sits on a shelf in the maintenance building and is ready as a backup when needed.

The NJBBA lost someone dear to us, Patrick James Leahey passed this June 4th, 2018. Pat #831 was a 30 year NJBBA member, a long standing member of the Berkeley Striper club and a founding member of Friends of Island Beach. He was awarded "Volunteer of the Year" for his efforts in ceremonies held for every one of those organizations. Pat served on active duty with the U.S. Army and included time as an Officer and Platoon Leader. Pat had an incredible willingness to succeed which led him to great accomplishments. His family and friends are very proud of a life well led.



Since "The Shack" was originally constructed in approximately 1911, it has survived endless northeasters, hurricanes and relocations. I was, excuse the pun, blown away when "The Shack" stood strong against the rampages of super storm Sandy. There is a wonderful history of "The Judge's Shack" written by Judge Hartshorne's (who purchased the "Shack" in 1942) daughter, the late Penelope Hartshorne Batcheler. This history can be found on our NJBBA.org website. I encourage you to check it out.

In case you haven't heard, "The Shack" is no longer in private ownership. Prior to his passing, the Judge's son John generously transferred the title to the State of New Jersey. It probably comes as no surprise that the State does not have the necessary funds to maintain the structure. Therefore, a small group of people have formed "The Friends of the Judge's Shack," a 501c3 organization formed to obtain funds and maintain "The Shack". Volunteer help is the majority of the assistance.

Many bath houses, a marina, swimming pool and other permanent structures were planned. The people of New Jersey rebelled, hence the bumper stickers. The Park folks got the message and then followed with a long period of management for preservation.

Is it possible the State has dusted off their original plans? A privately operated restaurant and bar at OB-1, the northern bath house, has opened. Is this in keeping with "ISLAND BEACH IS FOR THE BIRDS?" Everywhere we look in Park regulations we read, "No alcohol permitted." There has always been a hidden conflict with this regulation at Island Beach when we consider the Governor's Mansion and the Bay House. They are always dry, right?

Now there exists a potential situation where someone in the Park with a cold beer and ham sandwich will likely receive a summons while another person within the Park is embraced doing the exact same thing at the restaurant/bar. I know full well the world is often not a fair place, but an effort should be made to make it as fair as possible for all.

Is it time to bring the various Park stakeholders together once again to closely monitor N.J. State Parks Department plans for park development and privatization? In my view, neither is a good thing. Bumper stickers worked years ago; hopefully they won't be needed again.






